
CLARK COUNTY AG DOCUMENTARY AIRED ON PBS & JOURNAL SENTINEL



2021 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

- CCEDC has/is working with 52 + clients over the past year. These clients were assisted with business purchases (business retention), expansion, project completion, and new projects. The total values were over \$14.8 million with 95 + additional jobs created.
- Numerous site/building searches are handled by our office annually. Very few large commercial or even small/ downtown buildings are available. CCEDC&TB is helping with several new building construction and expansion projects in the county.
- CCEDC logged an average of 335 calls and over 600 emails per month for assistance with tourism and business development, among other things.
- We are available 24/7 for any type of assistance needed via office and director's cell phone.

COUNTY BROADBAND STUDY COMPLETED

WCWRPC & CCEDC&TB just completed and released the newest countywide Broadband Study dated 8/2/2021. The entire study can be found on our website. CCECD&TB has led a countywide and regional team approach to solving our connectivity issues for well over 12 years. Solving our connection needs is crucial for our agriculture, telemedicine, education and so much more. Recently the Clark County Board has commissioned a committee to take a lead on moving forward. Along with the county we remain involved with the regional team and have just learned that the State of Wisconsin will assist the entire state by region/county on collecting speed data to help build a stronger additional base report for broadband providers to use as a jumping board to apply for funding to ramp up rural areas as well as urban.



TOURISM & MARKETING

We are extremely fortunate to have a great group of volunteer tourism leaders that meet monthly with their focus on our county's future. Throughout the year, CCEDC&TB promoted upcoming events with marketing flyers, posters, and calendar of events available on our website clarkcountywi.org. Many flyers and promotional materials have been created on specialty features such as Shop and Eat Local, Hardware Stores, Food Hubs, Gift Shops of Clark County etc. These are also shared with our media partners. 

THE HIGHGROUND EXPANSION

The Highground has warmly welcomed a skyrocketing number of visitors in 2021 with the annual numbers at 225,000 visitors and growing.

The Highground Rising campaign for expansion and improvements is currently underway and includes a new 12,000 square-foot Welcome and Visitor Center, improved parking, compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act and increased financial stability and long-term sustainability with the pay-off of the \$450,000 mortgage. The funding is currently being raised for the projected start date of 2023.
