

## **Black River in Clark County**

The Black River starts as a small stream flowing out of Black Lake in Northern Taylor County. It flows for nearly 200 miles before emptying into the Mississippi River at La Crosse.

As the water filters through the wetland, organic acids leach out of the decaying wetland plants and other organic material, causing the black coloration of the river. The stained water isn't harmful, and actually limits the growth of noxious algae blooms or nuisance plants that can interfere with recreational activities.

Members of the Friends of the Black River are involved in various activities and programs including stream monitoring, aquatic invasive species monitoring, river and land based cleanups and community education outreach. If you enjoy fishing, canoeing, kayaking, or just like taking in the amazing views of the Black River and want to keep this waterway and watershed healthy, Friends of the Black River is the group for you!
